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PREFACE

This report is a profile of the supply and distribution of physicians licensed in New York State based on information compiled by the Center for Health Workforce Studies. With presentation of physician workforce data at several aggregate levels including state, region, county, and specialty, the report is intended to provide useful information for policy makers, educators, and other interested parties across the state.

This report was prepared by the Center for Health Workforce Studies (CHWS), by David Armstrong, Rakkoo Chung, Stuart Daman, and Gaetano Forte. Funding for this report was provided by the New York State Department of Health. CHWS, established in 1996, is based at the School of Public Health, University at Albany, State University of New York (SUNY). The mission of CHWS is to provide timely, accurate data and conduct policy-relevant research about the health workforce. The research conducted by CHWS supports and promotes health workforce planning and policymaking at local, regional, state, and national levels. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report summarizes information from the New York State Physician Licensure Re-registration Survey and the SK&A Office-based Physician Database, as adjusted to official counts of licensed physicians in 2014. In addition to presenting basic data for the state as a whole, the report contains a series of statistical profiles: 1 for each New York State Department of Labor region, 1 for each county, 1 for each medical specialty group, and 1 for each individual medical specialty.

Several of the most important observations about these data are summarized below:

- Of the 92,984 licensed physicians in New York, 78% (72,969) were active patient care physicians practicing in the state
 - O Of these, 70% were located in downstate New York and 92% were in urban counties
- The ratio of physicians to the population was highest in the Long Island region, with 432 active patient care physicians per 100,000 population
 - O The ratio was lowest in the North Country, with 215 physicians per 100,000 population
- More than 22,000 physicians (30% of the total) reported 1 of the primary care specialties (family medicine, general internal medicine, and general pediatrics) as their principal specialty
- The most common principal specialty reported among active patient care physicians was general internal medicine (11,188 or 15% of the total)
 - O The next most common principal specialties were family medicine (8%), general pediatrics (7%), and psychiatry (7%)
- Seventy-eight percent (78%) of physicians indicated they were certified by the nationally recognized American Board of Medical Specialties in their principal specialty
 - O This figure varied significantly across specialties, from 59% in child and adolescent psychiatry to 87% in thoracic surgery
- Group practice was the largest principal practice setting in 2014, reported by 33% of responding physicians
 - O Hospital practice (31%) and solo practice (25%) were the next most frequently reported practice settings
- New York physicians were predominantly male (66%) in 2014
 - O Women physicians were younger than men, reflecting the growing number of women entering the profession
 - O The average age of female physicians was 48 versus 53 for male physicians
- Seventy-two percent (72%) of physicians were non-Hispanic Whites
 - O Underrepresented minorities (URMs) (Blacks/African Americans, Hispanics/Latinos, and American Indians/Alaska Natives) made up 9% of the physician workforce in 2014, but approximately 35% of New York's population

- Thirty-three percent (33%) of active patient care physicians reported they were international medical graduates (IMGs), meaning they attended medical school in a foreign country (other than Canada)
 - O There were significant variations in the percentage of IMGs by specialty (eg, 50% of pathologists reported being IMGs while only 8% of dermatologists reported being IMGs)

BACKGROUND

Physicians are central to the delivery of health care to the citizens of New York. This report provides a variety of numerical measures of the size and nature of the physician workforce in the state. An effort has been made to design the tables and the figures in the report to reveal patterns that can help planners and policy makers develop programs to improve health care in the state.

The New York Health Workforce Data System

In 2014, over 92,000 physicians held licenses from the New York State Education Department to practice medicine in New York. All physicians are required to register with the State Education Department every 2 years. When physicians renew their licenses they are also provided with the opportunity to complete a survey (Appendix A) that requests information about a number of demographic, professional, and practice characteristics. This survey has been ongoing since 1997 and there have been more than 340,000 responses. However, in recent years the response rate to the survey has declined substantially. While the response rate for the survey used to be above 75%, during the last 5 years it has dropped below 5%. As a result, data from the survey were supplemented with information from the SK&A Officebased Physician Database³ to form the bases of this report. The SK&A Office-based Physician Database includes information about a physician's practice address and specialty, but it does not contain information about the number of hours a physician practices each week and other important practice characteristics. The SK&A data also only includes information for approximately half of the physicians licensed in the state. Once the New York Licensure Re-registration Survey data was supplemented with the SK&A data, the new database contained information on more than 60,000 licensed physicians in the state. However, for a number of variables (eg, setting) there were high levels of missing data (see Appendix B). Therefore, caution should be used when interpreting the numbers presented in this report.

Limitations

It is important to note several limitations of this profile caused by the reduced response rate to the re-registration survey and inadequacy of the data sources used to supplement the survey data. These limitations include:

- Limited number of workforce variables, including a key measure of physician work effort: full-time equivalents
- Limited trend analysis and comparisons over time
- Less robust estimates due to aging observations
- Data quality continuing to deteriorate over time

Efforts were made to present as much data as we felt comfortable presenting. Unless the response rate to the re-registration survey increases or some alternative data collection solution is implemented, the quality of the physician data will continue to decline. For this profile, we were unable to present data on patient care work effort (FTEs) for the physician workforce. As the observations in the physician re-reregistration data continue to age, there will be other potential exclusions, such as the individual county and specialty profiles. Eventually, this report will no longer be viable as the data necessary to support it will not be available.

The map below shows the names of and the counties that comprise each workforce region.



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Counties with populations of less than 200,000 are considered rural. 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





Figure C-1. Map of Physicians Per Population in New York Counties, 2014
