





Prior Research on US-IMGs

- US-IMGs outperform other IMGs on the USMLE
- US-IMGs more persistent in taking the USMLE than other IMGs
- US-IMGs have higher ECFMG certification rates than other IMGs
- US-IMGs are more likely to practice in primary care specialties


Data

- Primary Source: NY resident exit survey
- Annual survey of last year residents and fellows between 1998 and 2003; biennial since 2005
- To date: 20,836 of 32,158 exiters have completed the survey (65% response rate)
- Includes items on demographics, education and training history, and job search experience





Median Age of Physicians Completing Training in NY, 1998-2005







Percent Reporting Difficulty Finding a Satisfactory Practice Position






Summary
