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PREFACE

This report offers a profile of the supply and distribution of physicians licensed in New York based on the latest data collected from the Center for Health Workforce Studies' ongoing New York State Physician Licensure Re-registration Survey. With presentations of physician workforce data at several aggregate levels, including state, region, county, and specialty, the report is intended to provide useful information for policy makers, educators, and other interested parties across the state.

This report was prepared by the Center for Health Workforce Studies, School of Public Health, University at Albany, State University of New York by David P. Armstrong and Gaetano J. Forte. This report and data collection effort was funded by the New York State Department of Health. The Center is dedicated to the collection, analysis, and distribution of health workforce data to assist health, professional and educational organizations; policy makers; and the public understand issues related to the supply, demand, distribution, and use of health workers. 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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report summarizes the responses to the New York State Physician Licensure Re-registration Survey. The counts of physicians and the profile of their demographic characteristics are the latest available for the state of New York.

In addition to presenting basic data for the state as a whole, the report describes five series of statistical profiles: one for the state, one for each geographic region, one for each county, one for each medical specialty group, and one for each individual medical specialty.

Several of the most important observations about these data are summarized below:

- ❖ Of the 82,828 licensed physicians in New York, 78% (64,818) were active patient care physicians practicing in New York. Of these, 72% were located in downstate New York¹ and 91% were in urban counties.²
- ❖ The ratio of full-time equivalent (FTE)³ physicians to the population was highest in the Long Island region, with 342 active patient care FTE physicians per 100,000 population. The ratio was lowest in the Mohawk Valley, with 172 FTE physicians per 100,000 population.
- ❖ Between 2004 and 2008, some regions experienced very little growth in the number of active patient care FTE physicians per 100,000 population. The Mohawk Valley and North Country regions experienced growth of 3%.
- ❖ More than 19,000 physicians (30% of the total) reported one of the primary care specialties (family medicine, general internal medicine, and general pediatrics) as their principal specialty.
- ❖ Between 2004 and 2008, primary care FTE physicians per 100,000 population grew in all regions of the state. However, Central New York experienced the least amount of growth in primary care FTE physician supply (1%).
- ❖ The number of non-primary care FTE physicians per 100,000 population grew in all regions of the state. The growth of the non-primary care FTE physician supply was lowest in Central New York and Mohawk Valley (3% for each).
- ❖ The most common principal specialty reported among active patient care physicians was general internal medicine (10,064 or 16% of the total). The next most common principal specialties were psychiatry (9%), family medicine (7%), and general pediatrics (7%).
- ❖ The two fastest growing specialty groups between 2004 and 2008 were internal medicine specialties (e.g., cardiovascular disease, gastroenterology, nephrology, and rheumatology) and facility based specialties (anesthesiology, pathology, and radiology). The ratio of FTEs per 100,000 population grew by 11% for these specialty groups over the time period. In contrast, the average rate of growth for all specialties was 6%. General surgery was the only specialty to decline over the time period (-6%).

³ Due to changing physician practice patterns FTE (full-time equivalent) physicians are the most appropriate metric for describing physicians practicing in New York.

- ❖ Eighty percent (80%) of physicians indicated they were certified by the nationally recognized American Board of Medical Specialties in their principal specialty. This figure varied significantly across specialties, from 62% in child and adolescent psychiatry to 89% in dermatology and pathology.
- ❖ Group practice was the largest principal practice setting in 2008, reported by 36% of responding physicians. Solo practice (28%) and hospital practice (27%) were the next most frequently reported practice settings.
- ❖ New York physicians were predominantly male (69%) in 2008. However, women physicians were significantly younger than men, reflecting the growing number of women entering the profession. The average age of female physicians was 48 versus 54 for male physicians.
- ❖ Sixty-nine percent (69%) of physicians were non-Hispanic Whites. Underrepresented minorities (URMs) (Blacks/African Americans, Hispanics/Latinos, and American Indians/Alaska Natives) made up 10% of the physician workforce in 2008, but approximately 35% of New York's population.
- ❖ Thirty-six percent (36%) of active patient care physicians reported they were international medical graduates (IMGs), that is, they attended medical school in a foreign country (other than Canada). There were significant variations in the percentage of IMGs by specialty. For instance, 52% of pathologists reported being IMGs while only 9% of dermatologists reported being IMGs.

BACKGROUND

Physicians are central to the delivery of health care to the citizens of New York. This report provides a variety of numerical measures of the size and nature of the physician workforce in New York. An effort has been made to design the tables and the figures in the report to reveal patterns that can help planners and policy makers develop programs to improve health care in New York.

The New York Health Workforce Data System

In 2008, over 82,000 physicians held licenses from the New York State Education Department to practice medicine in New York. All physicians are required to register with the State Education Department every two years. Included in the materials distributed to physicians to re-register their licenses is a questionnaire (Appendix A) that requests physicians to provide information on a number of personal, professional, and practice characteristics. The responses to these questionnaires during the years 2007 and 2008 were the basis for the tabulations presented in this report. Where data were missing, attempts were made to substitute data from previous iterations of the survey. After adding data from the previous years, the survey had an estimated response rate of 79% (65,633 out of 82,828). These data are one component of the New York Health Workforce Data System administered by the Center for Health Workforce Studies. Other components of the data system include similar surveys of dentists, dental hygienists, and registered nurses licensed to practice in New York. Three new surveys are also being prepared for midwives, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants. Data related to the population and health status were obtained from the New York State Department of Health and the U.S. Census Bureau (see Appendix B).

Several files were created from the survey data, each including slightly different numbers of respondents (see Appendix B). One of these files, File E, formed the basis of this report. File E, which includes all active patient care physicians who do not practice exclusively outside of New York, was used to examine the overall work profile of physicians active in medicine in the state. File E excludes medical residents since they are not required to be licensed and many of them are not eligible for licensure. File E also incorporates a weighting factor to account for non-respondents to the survey.

REGIONAL PROFILES

Figure 1. Map of CHWS New York Health Workforce Regions

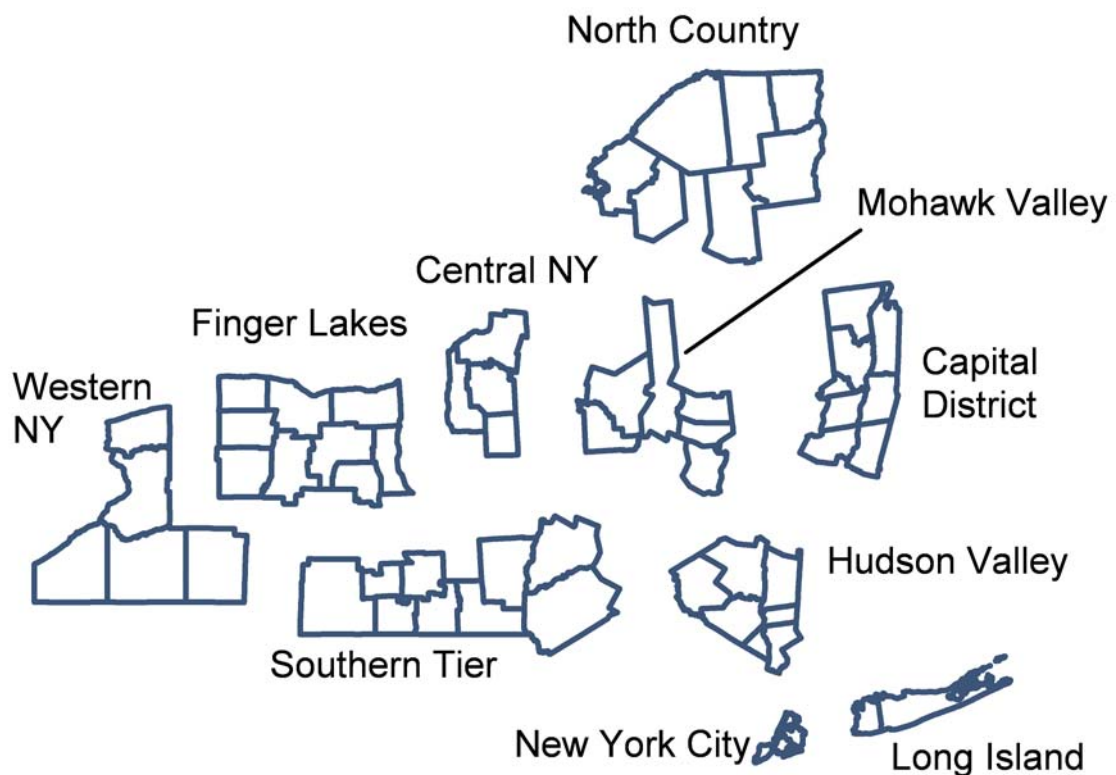

Active Patient Care FTEs per 100,000 Population by Region in New York, 2008



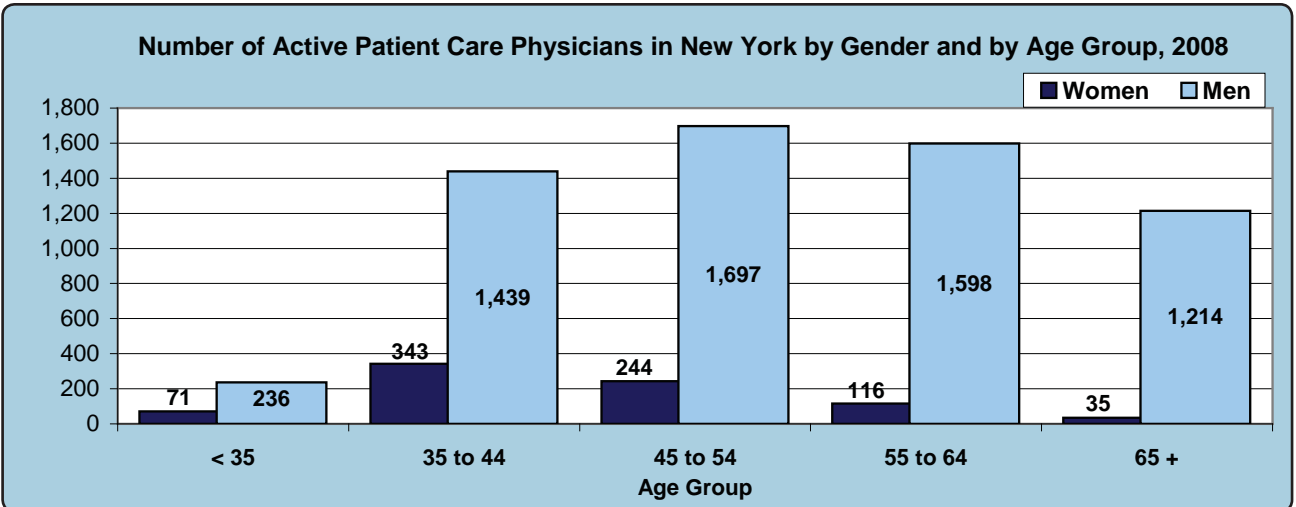
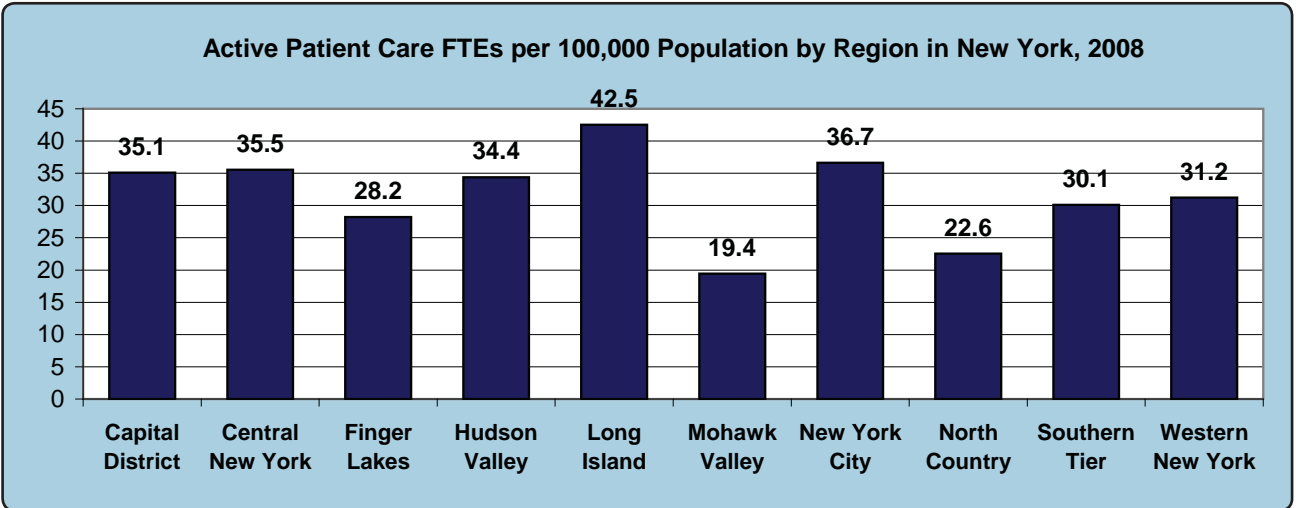
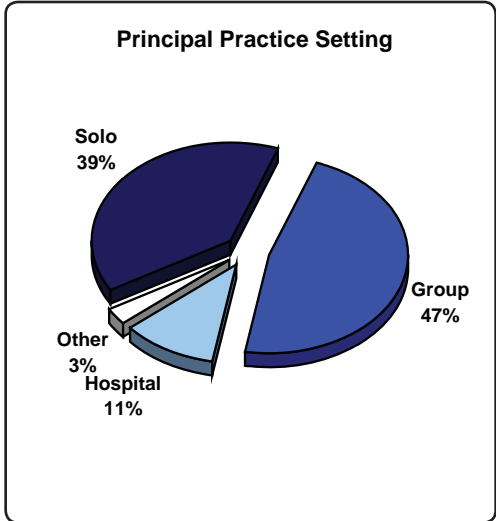

Active Patient Care FTEs per 100,000 Population by Region in New York, 2008



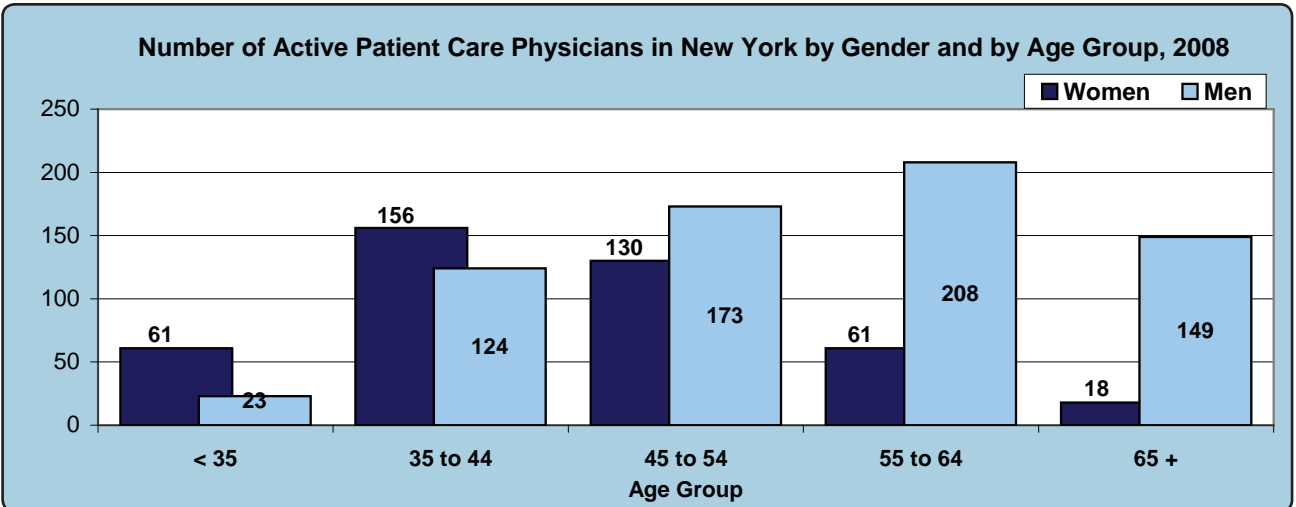
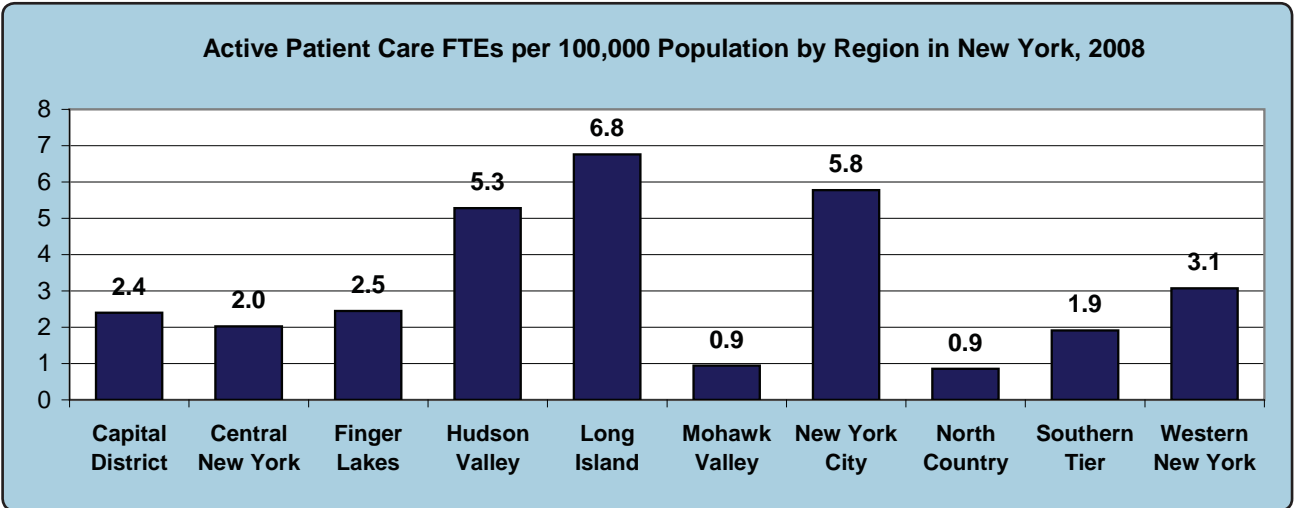
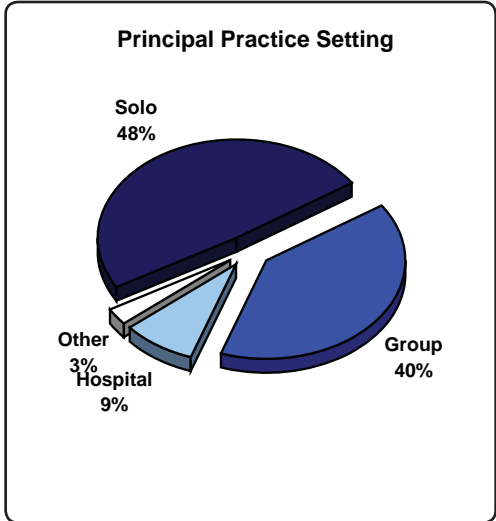

Active Patient Care FTEs per 100,000 Population by Region in New York, 2008



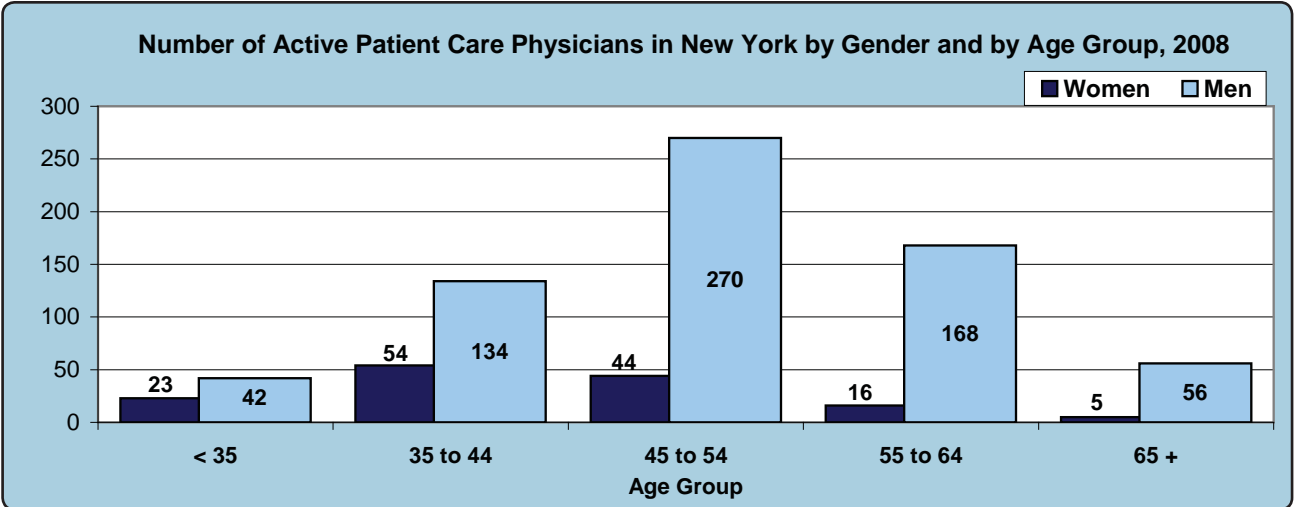
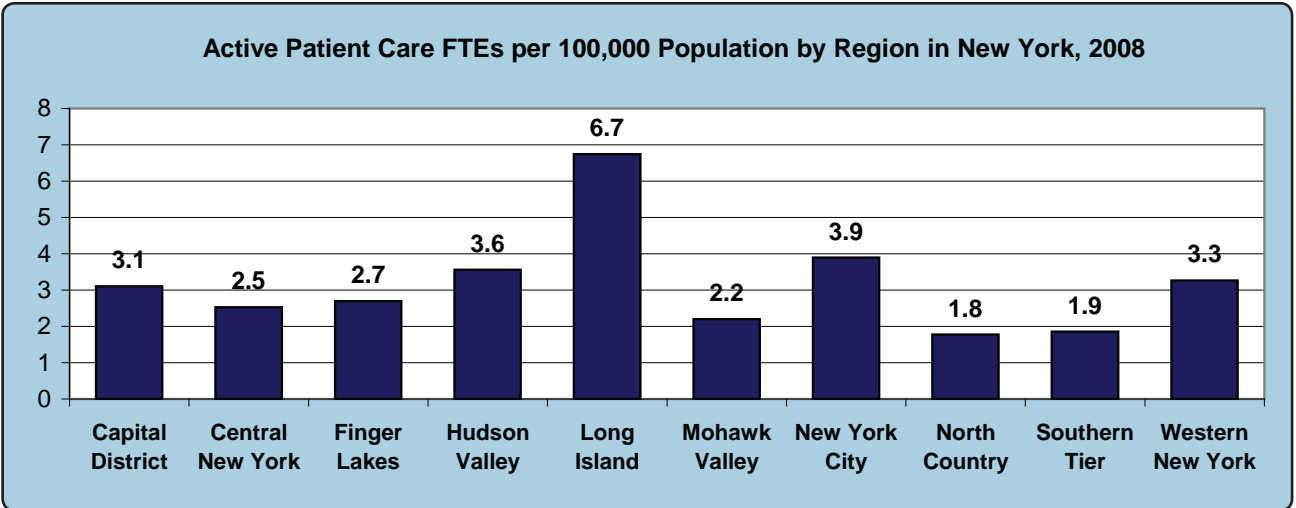
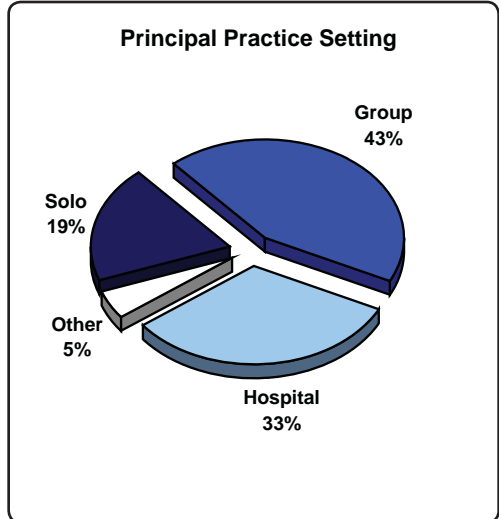

Active Patient Care FTEs per 100,000 Population by Region in New York, 2008



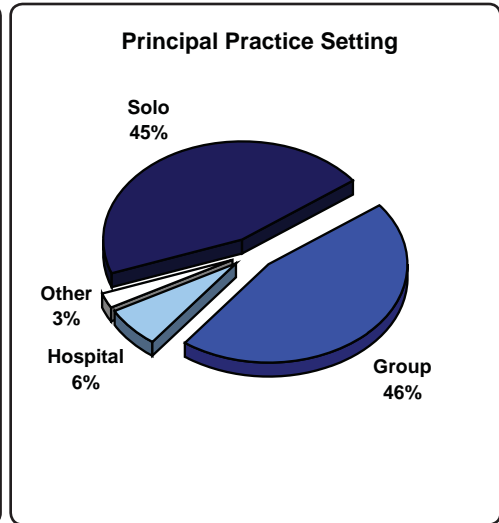

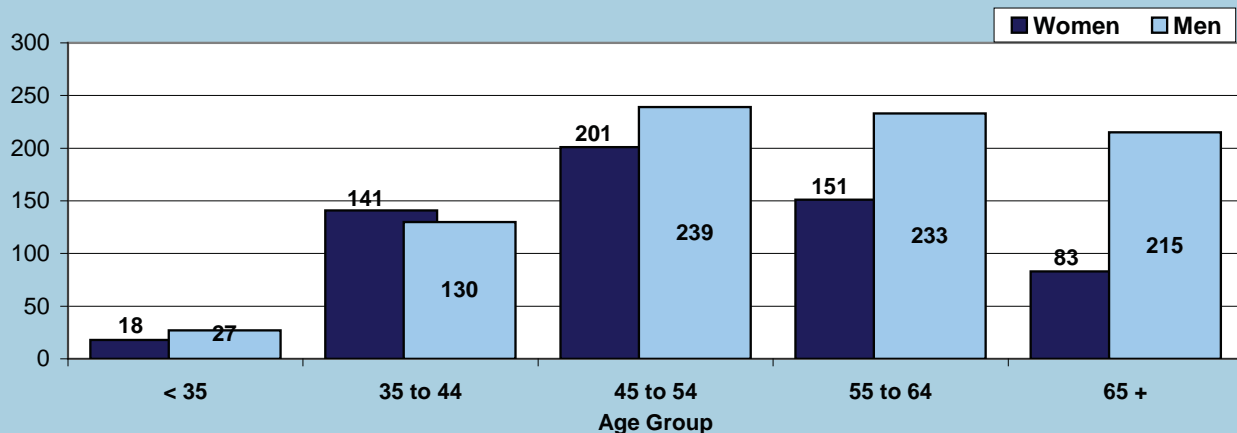

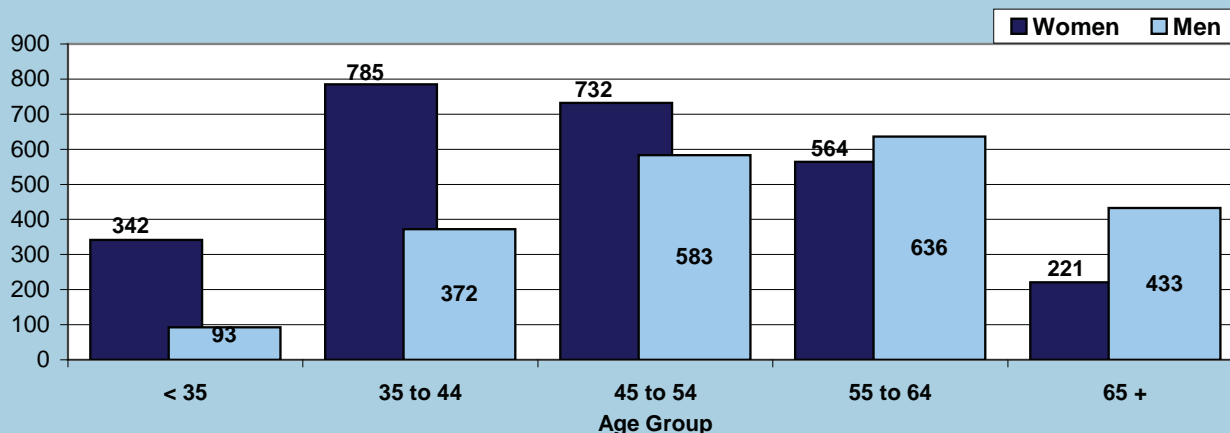

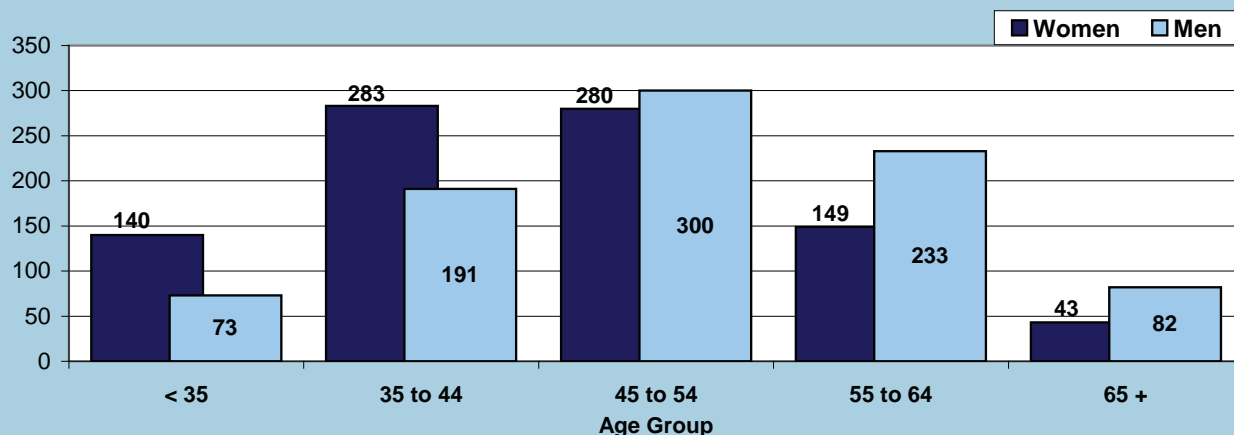

Active Patient Care FTEs per 100,000 Population by Region in New York, 2008



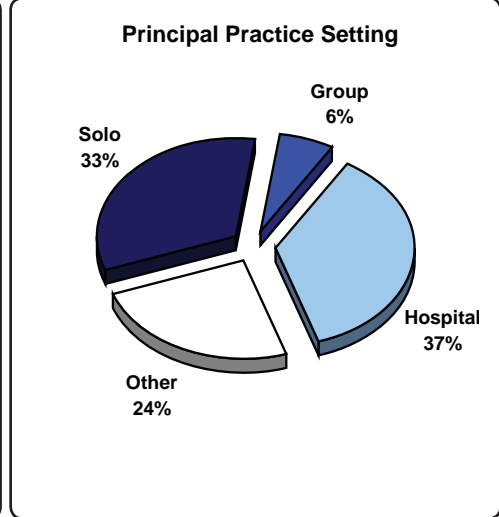

Active Patient Care FTEs per 100,000 Population by Region in New York, 2008



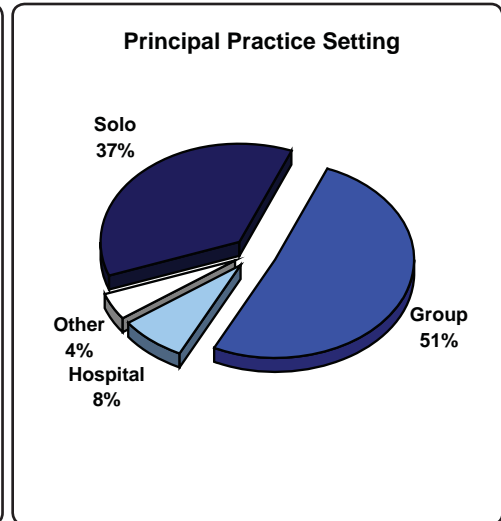

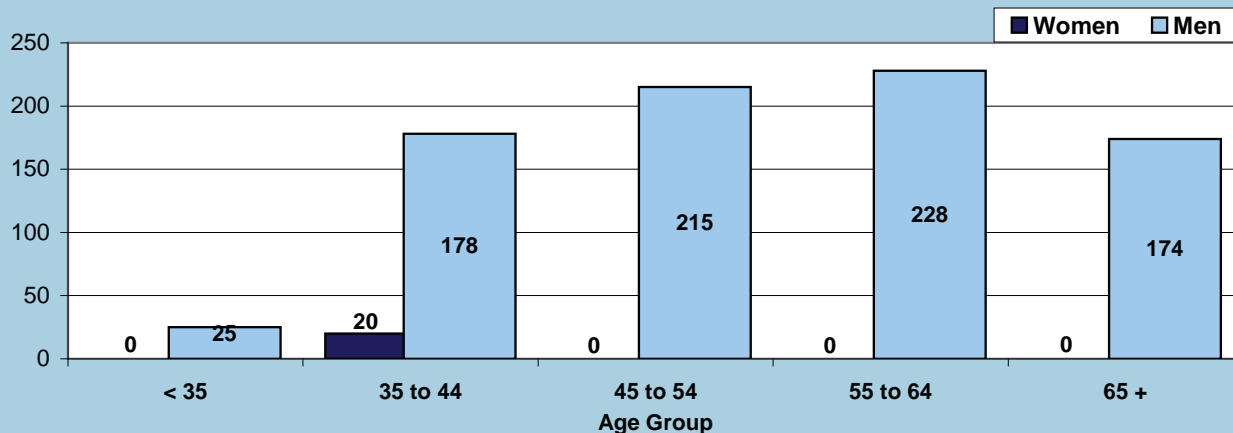

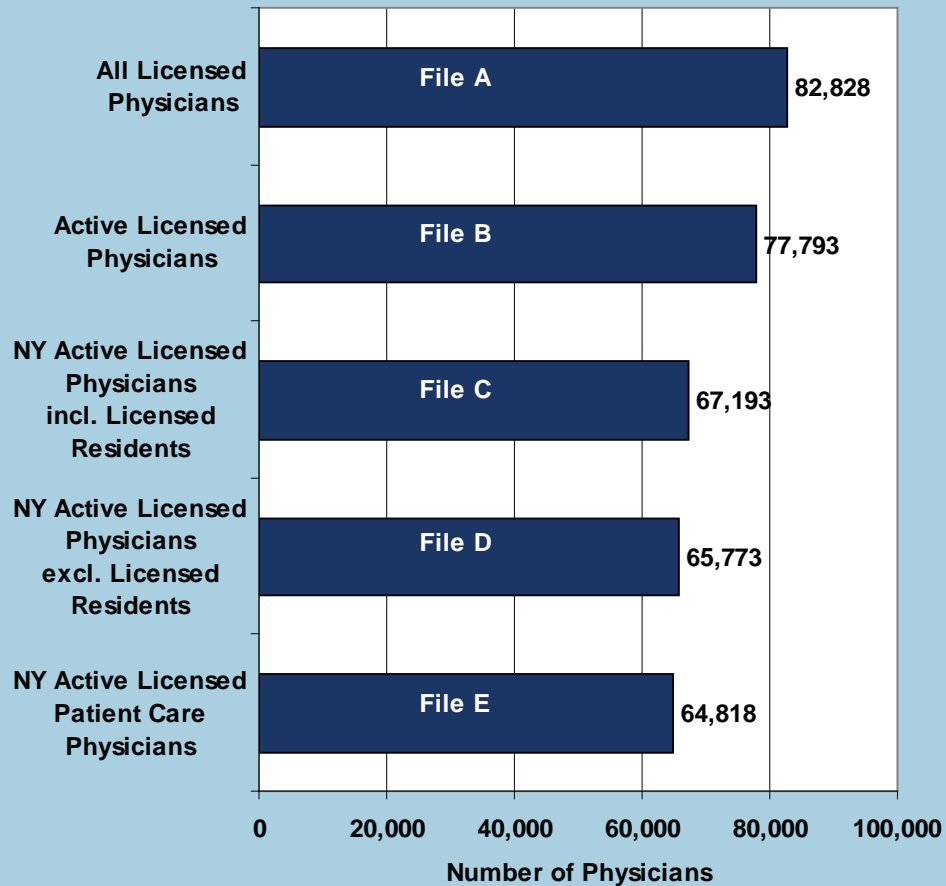

2. 2004 Active Patient Care Physicians in New York Estimates

The 2004 physician estimates used in the change in supply calculation were based on data from the 2003 and 2004 New York State Physician Licensure Re-registration Survey and were calculated analogously to the 2008 estimates. During 2003 and 2004, the survey had an estimated response rate of 82% (62,586 out of 76,116).

3. Full-time Equivalent Estimates

The Full-time Equivalent (FTE) estimates were calculated as follows:

$$\text{FTE} = \text{Patient Care Hours} / 40$$
, where Patient Care Hours (Q6) have been estimated by assigning a minimum and maximum value to each Patient Care Hours category (see below) and then making a random draw from a uniform distribution between these minimum and maximum points for each respondent.

7. Important Notes

Due to the periodicity of the registration process in New York, the data reported here should not be viewed as a snapshot in time of the current physician workforce. Rather, they should be seen as a general picture of the physician workforce during the years 2007 and 2008. For convenience, however, the numbers and tabulations reported reference the year 2008. It also must be emphasized that the data presented in this report are estimates and are subject to a certain degree of error, especially in the case of rare events, small populations, and missing data. Finally, due to confidentiality agreements, cells with counts below five are indicated as "--" throughout the report.

The principal practice location zip code was used to place individuals within a county. However, in some instances, zip codes overlap county boundaries. As a result, care should be taken when interpreting the estimates.
