


# Background

- Previously it has been found that female physicians earn less than male physicians
- Are gender differences in physician income increasing or decreasing over time?
- New York Resident Exit Survey • Conducted annually since 1998
  - A survey of all residents and fellows completing training in New York (more than 5,000 annually)
  - Average annual response rate greater than 60%




#### The Income of New Physicians has Increased Over Time





### The Percent of Females Completing a GME Program has Increased Over Time






## Are Gender Differences in Physician Income Increasing or Decreasing?

- New York Resident Exit Survey (2001 2019)
- Respondents with Confirmed Practice Plans OIMGs on Temporary Visas were Excluded
- Series of OLS Regression Models (one for each year of the survey)
- Adjusting for a variety of factors including:

   Age, Race, Type of Medical Education, Citizenship Status, Practice Location, Practice Setting, and Specialty

#### **Gender Differences in Physician Income by Primary Care Specialties**, 2017-2019

	Income Difference	Significance
Family Medicine	-\$18,637	.0004
General IM	-\$14,058	.0000
General Pediatrics	-\$7,760	.0005
Obstetrics/Gynecology	-\$10,797	.0038

Negative dollars indicate that females earn less than males



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
